## **Erasmus Report Lyon**

Studying abroad through the Erasmus program has been a lifechanging experience for me. I was fortunate to receive valuable assistance from Angela Steinhusen, who played a crucial role in guiding me through the Erasmus application process and securing the necessary funding. While preparing for this mobility, I encountered the necessity of acquiring private insurance, and I found Dr. Walter to be a reliable (approx.. 220 euros for 6 months) and easy-to-work-with insurance provider, making the City skyline view from Fourviére application process hassle-free.



Securing suitable accommodation can be competitive in bustling cities like Lyon. My recommendation is to opt for an agency like OQORO, despite the slightly higher costs, as it guarantees a room before your arrival, significantly reducing stress. Alternatively, searching on public websites such as leboncoin may yield cheaper options, but beware of potential scams and difficulties in obtaining short-term contracts.

During my time in Lyon, I had the unique opportunity to do my Erasmus internship at BioMérieux, a prominent biotechnology company. This marked my first experience working in a large multinational company. The project was both challenging and rewarding, supported by experienced scientists. Collaborating on the development of a new workflow for monoclonal antibodies using cutting-edge technology was both thrilling and fulfilling. Additionally, interning at a company has the advantage of often receiving a small salary, easing the financial burden of living in an expensive city like Lyon. I recommend seeking internships in companies that align with your research goals to maximize the overall experience.

Adjusting to life in a new country can be daunting, but with an abundance of fellow international students, making new friends becomes an enjoyable process. I found friends through connections from friends, joining expat Facebook groups, and living in shared apartments with locals, allowing me to immerse myself in their culture and practice my French. Volunteering with the Erasmus Student Network (ESN) in Lyon proved to be a pivotal social avenue.
