It is our pleasure to invite you today to the Herrenhausen Symposium "Individualized Infection Medicine – The Future Is Now", which will take place in Hannover, Germany, from June 21-23, 2018.

The concepts of individualized medicine and custom-made therapies for each patient hold untapped potential with a view to the diagnostic workup and treatment of infections. Realizing this potential will require evolving, combining and applying leading know-how and cutting-edge technologies to establish the highest quality of individualized medicine possible.

This Herrenhausen Symposium aims at fostering international and interdisciplinary collaboration by bringing together outstanding experts from different fields to address major scientific questions, tackle ethical, social and economic considerations and discuss the requirements for regulation processes in individualized medicine. The exchange of ideas and resulting discussions will help to guide the path forward for individualized medicine as a whole and individualized infection medicine in particular. The discussion offers an interesting opportunity for scientists of various fields to bring in their perspective and at the same time gain fascinating new perspectives themselves. The conference is jointly organized by the Hannover Medical School (MHH), the Helmholtz Centre for Infection Research (HZI), Braunschweig, the Centre for Individualized Infection Medicine (CIIM) and the Volkswagen Foundation.

The conference language is English.

Travel Grants

The Volkswagen Foundation offers travel grants for PhD students or Post Docs (max. 5 years since PhD) researching on infectious diseases aiming for new approaches to optimize clinical care. Applicants can win one of 30 travel grants to take part in the Herrenhausen Symposium "Individualized Infection Medicine" in Hannover, Germany. Successful applicants will get the chance to present their research in a poster session and 10 projects will be selected for lightning talks. The posters will be displayed during the entire symposium. Applicants are required to apply until January 10th, 2018 by using the application site (www.helmholtz-hzi.de/hs_travel_grants).
