# Welcome to Hannover Medical School (MHH)

A warm welcome to <u>Hannover Medical School</u> – *Medizinische Hochschule Hannover* or MHH -, the only freestanding medical university in Germany. It is one of six universities / colleges situated in the city of Hannover.

The MHH campus covers an area of more than 50 football fields, adjacent to *Karl-Wiechert-Allee* in the *Gross-Buchholz* district. In the center of the campus, you will find the main hospital, surrounded by the Departments of Pediatrics, Gynecology, Dental, Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery, the Transplant Research Center, the Hans Borst Center for Heart and Stem Cell Research, the Pediatric Research Center, further research and teaching facilities, the library, child daycare centers, residential and administrative buildings, as well as sports facilities. The Department of Orthopedics is located in the Annastift hospital. In the upcoming years, the MHH campus will see the biggest construction project in the School's history: The main hospital building, the central A&E unit and the surgical facilities are to be rebuilt — at the *Stadtfelddamm*, with close physical connection to the campus.

The MHH is a full-service, 'supramaximal' care hospital with a nationwide catchment area. It comprises 18 medical centers with 75 departments and institutes, and 12 supporting units. Every year, more than 63,000 inpatients are treated here, along with more than 460,000 outpatients. Hardly any other university hospital in Germany treats patients with such serious conditions.

MHH is a pioneer in transplant medicine and one of the world's leading transplant centers. Some 400 organs are transplanted here every year - more than anywhere else in Germany; along with more than 130 bone marrow transplants.

The School is the world leader in cochlear implantation, a procedure inserting a small electronic device into the inner ear to stimulate hearing. It also enjoys an outstanding international reputation in the treatment of cancer, lung diseases, heart, kidney and metabolic disorders, as well as in surgery.

Interdisciplinary cooperation is a major priority at MHH. The School's <u>Claudia von Schilling Center for Oncology</u> is Lower Saxony's largest certified oncological center. It combines interdisciplinary treatment of cancer patients with high-quality oncological research. Other interdisciplinary facilities include the <u>Interdisciplinary Allergy Centre (MHH-AZ)</u>, the <u>German Hearing Center Hannover</u>, the Center for Facial Malformations, and the <u>Center for Rare Diseases (ZSE)</u>.

MHH aims at providing patients with the best possible treatment — a goal to which the School's scientists and its physicians engaged in research are also dedicated. They have made MHH a leading national research institution. They also ensure that their research activities are closely linked to healthcare provision, allowing scientific findings to be applied rapidly and effectively for prevention, diagnostics and treatment.

The scientists at MHH are involved in numerous alliances aimed at optimally advancing research. They include the <u>Research Center for Translational Regenerative Medicine</u> (formerly REBIRTH Cluster of Excellence, focusing on regenerative medicine), <u>Hearing4all</u> (devoted to auditory research), the <u>RESIST Cluster of Excellence</u> (focusing on infection and immunity), several Networks of Excellence ("Kompetenznetze"), <u>BREATH</u> (the Hannover-based network of the German Center for Lung Research, DZL), and the <u>German Centre for Infection Research</u> (DZIF). The diverse research landscape includes Collaborative Research Centers, Research Units and Research Training Groups, as well as hundreds of other projects.

For the purpose of pooling and integrating knowledge, MHH collaborates with a great variety of partners, such as the <u>Helmholtz Centre for Infection Research (HZI)</u> in Braunschweig – within <u>TWINCORE</u> and in the <u>Centre for Individualised Infection Medicine (CiiM)</u>. The <u>Lower Saxony Center for Biomedical Engineering, Implant Research and Development (NIFE)</u> is a joint center with <u>Leibniz University Hannover</u> and the <u>University of Veterinary Medicine Hannover (TiHo)</u> for developing cutting-edge implants. Within the <u>Clinical Research Center (CRC)</u>, MHH is working together with ITEM (a Fraunhofer institute) and the HZI to ensure optimal quality and safety for patients in clinical studies.

To remain an attractive education center and employer, MHH is continuously working on an inclusive and family-friendly set-up. MHH is holding the <u>audit family-friendly university certificate</u> since 2005 and is a signatory to the '<u>Diversity Charter</u>'. The <u>Equal Opportunities Office</u> bundles the various areas of action and provides comprehensive, up-to-date information in both German and English.

At the heart of MHH's family-friendly policy is a whole range of childcare services. With almost 400 full-day care places for children aged eight weeks to 14 years and a wealth of flexible childcare options, MHH is a nationwide pioneer among academic institutions. Moreover, care for relatives is supported through consultations, in-house training and flexible working time models.

The Equal Opportunity Office also provides counseling and support if you are affected by discrimination. Since 2018, MHH has had a <u>coordination office for handling sexualized discrimination and violence</u>. Please reach out to them, if you need assistance.

MHH offers State Exam study programs in Medicine and Dentistry, a Master program with State Exam in Clinical Psychology and Psychotherapy, Bachelor programs in Biochemistry, Biology and Midwifery, Master programs in Biochemistry, Biomedicine, Biomedical Data Sciences, Infectious Diseases and One Health (IDOH) and Public Health, and PhD programs in Molecular Medicine, Infection Biology, Regenerative Sciences, Systems Neuroscience, Epidemiology, Biomedical Data Science (BIOMEDAS), and Auditory Science. The programs in Biology, Biochemistry, Biomedicine, BIOMEDAS, and IDOH are organized in collaboration with the Leibniz University of Hannover and the School of Veterinary Medicine Hannover.

The total number of students amounts to over 3.000. From A like Afghanistan to V like Vietnam: people from more than 100 countries study and work at MHH, making the School one of the most international workplaces in the capital of Lower Saxony.

MHH is internationally renowned for excellence in patient care, research and teaching. Students, physicians and scientists from all over the world are keen to come to Hannover to study, work and conduct research. MHH organizes internships and semesters abroad for its students. International co-operations and networks with other universities and hospitals worldwide are constantly being expanded. In 2016, the School was awarded 'Internationalizing Higher Education' certification by the German Rectors' Conference. And MHH strives to continuously expand its international orientation. We very much look forward to your contribution!

Hannover Biomedical Research School (HBRS) has been the most international institution on MHH campus for more than 20 years. Approximately 700 to 800 students from all over the world are applying to our graduate school every year. 


# Arriving at the MHH

Hannover is easy to reach as it is situated quite in the middle of Northern Germany, in the region called Lower Saxony (*Niedersachsen*). The airport has intercontinental as well as extensive European connections. A direct rail link (*S-Bahn*) connects the airport with the main railway station in the city center. Hannover is also well connected to numerous other European and German cities by rail and by bus.

From the second basement of the main railway station, you can easily reach the MHH by taking the tram line no. U 1, U 2 or U 8 towards *Laatzen / Sarstedt / Gleidingen / Messe/Nord*. Get off at the second stop, *Aegidientorplatz*, and change to tram line U 4 towards *Roderbruch* on the opposite side of the platform. It takes about 20 minutes to reach the stop *Medizinische Hochschule*.

#### Accommodation

HBRS has only 10 rooms available in one of the *Studentenwerk's* dormitories. You will find more information about the dormitories on <a href="https://www.studentenwerk-hannover.de/en/living/overview">https://www.studentenwerk-hannover.de/wohnen/uebersicht</a> (German).

You should ensure that a written tenancy agreement is made once you have chosen a room or an apartment. You will also need a landlord's confirmation *(Wohnungsgeberbestätigung)* for your registration with the local authorities (see "

How to register with the German authorities").

One very popular option among students is to rent a private room in a shared apartment (Wohngemeinschaft or WG). When you rent a room in a "WG", you are a subtenant (Untermieter), which does not include the same rights as for the main tenant (Hauptmieter). Make sure to sign a subtenancy agreement before moving in.

You will find numerous offers for free rooms on the bulletin boards in the MHH or in the local newspapers. Some outgoing students also temporarily sublet their rooms to incomings.

#### **Health Insurance**

As all our international students need health insurance, we will also cover this topic in our orientation weeks.

If you are going to be employed (work contract with MHH), you best choose statutory health insurance.

<u>Recommendation for private health insurance for international students with a scholarship</u>: One possible tariff is the "<u>MAWISTA Student</u>" by MAWISTA (insurer: Allianz).

IMORTANT: Please apply for an insurance period of 60 months (the maximum), as it is really difficult to extend the insurance period if you have initially chosen a shorter one. It is possible to terminate the insurance contract within a month if necessary.

There are three different sub-tariffs: MAWISTA Student Classic, MAWISTA Student Classic Plus, and MAWISTA Student Comfort. We recommend you choose one of the latter two with more extensive coverage.

The MAWISTA Student insurance is relatively cheap and provides basic coverage for healthy people (unfortunately this is not available for Germans!). Please read the terms and conditions carefully and compare exactly what is covered by each tariff. Depending on the tariff, there may be restrictions if you need a vaccination or dental treatment, get pregnant, etc.

PLEASE NOTE: YOU MUST REGISTER FOR STATUTORY HEALTH INSURANCE IF YOU SUFFER FROM ANY PRE-EXISTING ILLNESS/ UNDERLYING HEALTH CONDITION!

#### Other Insurances

To cover private liability during your stay in Germany, please ask respective insurance companies for more information. Personal liability insurance is <u>highly recommended</u> to all incomings students and **is a must for all students receiving a scholarship! You have to make sure that the insurance covers your lab activities ("Teilnahme am fachpraktischen Unterricht").** 

We will cover this topic in our Welcome Week, and there will be an option to take out private liability insurance when opening a bank account.



# **University Library**

You will have free access to the  $\underline{\mathsf{MHH\ library}}$ . The opening hours are: Monday to Friday 8 a.m. - 10 p.m.; Saturday, Sunday and public holidays 9 a.m. - 8 p.m.

Your MHH student card is also your library card. You will find your user number on the back of the card. We will activate and register your card in the library during the Welcome Week.

The library offers regular training courses which you can take advantage of, e.g. on searching and managing literature or on research and writing with AI.

# **Computer Facilities / Internet / E-mail**

In the library of the Medical School there is a media room, where you will have free access to all computers and to the internet. You will receive detailed information in the orientation weeks.

You will receive a student E-mail address as well as an MHH E-Mail address organized by your department.



# **Sports Program**

# **Swimming pools outside MHH**

#### Indoor:

#### **Anderter Bad**

This is a rather quiet, simple swimming pool for sporty swimmers. In this swimming pool you can also learn scuba diving at the TSV Anderten.

#### Fössebad

One of Hannover's oldest swimming pools with an indoor and outdoor area. While the outdoor pool is used in summer, the indoor pools are closed.

#### **Misburger Bad**

Indoors in winter and outdoors in summer, the newly renovated "Kombibad Misburg" offers sporty and relaxed swimming for every season as well as a spacious sauna area.

#### **Nord-Ost-Bad**

This modern indoor pool situated directly at the *Mittellandkanal* offers separate swimming, fun and wellness areas as well as four saunas.

#### **Stadionbad**

The pool in Hannover sports park for swimmers who enjoy swimming 50-meter laps and high diving. It's also the venue for swimming competitions and water polo tournaments.

#### Stöckener Bad

This is the smallest municipal swimming pool in Hannover. There is a 25m Vario swimming pool with a lifting floor and a separate diving pool with 1m and 3m diving boards.

#### **Vahrenwalder Bad**

This is a newly renovated, sports-oriented family pool with a separate non-swimmers' pool. A special offer is women's swimming on Fridays from 5:30 to 8:30 p.m.

#### <u>aquaLaatzium</u>

This swimming pool offers extensive facilities such as a wellness area and an adventure pool, a 25-metre sports pool, a Body 2 Racer double slide, an outdoor saltwater pool, 11 saunas with relaxation house, a fitness studio, and restaurants.

#### Wasserwelt/ Water World Langenhagen

With a total of seven different sports and leisure pools with temperatures between 28 °C and 34 °C, a 100-metre-long tube slide and a vast sauna landscape there is something for everyone in this large and modern swimming pool in Langenhagen.

# Only outdoor (lakes and pools with swimming from May to September):

#### Hainhölzer Naturbad

This natural pool has a swimmers' pool with a diving area (diving rock), a non-swimmers' area with a beach, slide and waterfall as well as a toddlers' area. The water is not heated.

#### **Kleefelder Bad (Annabad)**

This popular swimming pool is run by the police sports club. It offers swimmers', non-swimmers' an paddling pools with a water temperature of at least 22°C, a large tree-lined lawn, table tennis, beach volleyball, a playground and more.

#### **Lister Bad**

This popular outdoor pool situated directly at the *Mittellandkanal* offers plenty of space to swim, play and relax and has a 10-meter diving tower.

The outdoor pool on the edge of the Ricklinger forest combines heated swimmers' and non-swimmers' pools (22°C) with access to one of the Ricklinger gravel ponds.

#### Strandbad / Lido Maschsee

Beach on the southern shore of the Maschsee in the very heart of Hannover with showers, sanitary facilities and a kiosk. The DLRG (German Life Saving Association) ensures safety for bathers.

#### **Volksbad / Public bath Limmer**

One of Hannover's oldest outdoor pools situated behind the old Conti factory Limmer with a water temperature of approx. 23°C. Here you can also regularly cheer on Waspo's water polo players. *Stockhardtweg 6, 30453 Hannover* 

# **Wietzepark**

The *Hufeisensee Wietzepark* is one of the lakes around Hannover that is easily accessible by bike and allows swimming under lifeguard supervision. There is also a high ropes course on the lake shore, and you can play beach volleyball, boules, football and more.

#### Altwarmbüchener See

The "Riviera of Hannover" offers a popular (and often very crowded) sandy beach in the west with service buildings, play and sunbathing areas, as well as a quieter shore to the east. There are also nature protection areas around the lake, so make sure to only swim in the designated areas.

# **Settling Down in Hannover**

Han(n)over is the capital of the German state of Lower Saxony *(Niedersachsen)*. With approximately 550.000 inhabitants it makes the fourth-largest largest city in Northern Germany and the 13<sup>th</sup> largest city in the entire country. Together with the 20 surrounding municipalities, the city of Hannover forms the Hannover Region with over 1.2 million inhabitants.



Traditionally, the English spelling is (Hanover). However, (Hannover), the German spelling with a double-(n), has become more popular in English. (...) The English pronunciation, with stress on the first syllable, is applied to both the German and English spellings, which is different from German pronunciation, with stress on the second syllable and a long second vowel."

The joint logo of the city and region of Hanover reflects the different spellings by means of a cut "N". At MHH, we traditionally use the spelling with double "N".

The city name may derive from the German "(am) hohen Ufer" (literally: 'on the high (river) bank'), but this has not been scientifically proven.

Hannover was founded in the Middle Ages and received town privileges in 1241. The city was an important transport and trading hub and a member of the Hanseatic League. In the 18<sup>th</sup> century, the electors of Brunswick-Lüneburg became monarchs of Great Britain and Ireland, marking the beginning of Hanoverian rule over the British Empire. The personal union ended with Queen Victoria, as Hannover could be inherited only by male heirs. Thus, Hanover passed to Ernest Augustus and remained a kingdom until 1866, when it was annexed by Prussia.

Being a major transport hub and production center, Hannover was largely destroyed by Allied air raids during World War II. A city model in the New Town Hall shows the extent of the destruction. The reconstruction was carried out as a "car-friendly" city with many multi-lane roads around the city center. St. Aegidien Church was never rebuilt; its ruins remain as a memorial to the victims of war and tyranny.

With Expo 2000, Hannover was the first and to date only German city to host an Expo. The Hannover fairground remains the largest in the world. The CeBIT, an annual computer expo, showcased the state of the art in information technology from 1986 to 2018. To this day, many important industry trade fairs such as the Hannover Messe/Fair take place here and attract hundreds of thousands of visitors every year.

Many large companies are located in Hannover (Region), such as *Volkswagen*, the German tire and automobile parts manufacturer *Continental AG*, the audio equipment company *Sennheiser*, the travel group *TUI AG* and

various insurance companies. The city is also home to several renowned universities, including MHH.

In 2014, UNESCO awarded Hanover the title of "UNESCO City of Music" for its extensive musical offerings. The city is also home to numerous museums and theaters, and the zoo has received multiple awards.

The local football team *Hannover 96* (nicknamed "Die Roten" / 'The Reds') currently plays in the *2. Bundesliga*, and the handball club *TSV Hannover-Burgdorf* in the *Handball-Bundesliga*. Three teams compete in the *Rugby-Bundesliga*. With the *Hannover Indians* and the *Hannover Scorpions*, Hannover region has two successful ice hockey clubs. Hannover is also one of Germany's hubs in water sports, especially in Water polo. Lake *Maschsee* hosts multiple sports events, amongst others international dragon boat races. The city's gymnasts and riders are also very successful. The *Hannover Marathon* is one of the largest running events in Germany and gets the whole city moving every year.

Hannover hosts the *Schützenfest Hannover*, the world's largest marksmen's festival, and the *Oktoberfest Hannover*, the second largest festival of its kind in Germany. The *Maschseefest* and the Christmas market also attract thousands of visitors every year.

Hannover's geographical location offers great opportunities to organize weekend excursions to Hamburg, Bremen, Berlin, the Hartz Mountains or even to the North Sea or the Baltic Sea. The City is a hub of the German high-speed ICE network and the autobahn network. Both the airport and the central bus station offer numerous national and international connections. The city itself has a well-developed tram, bus and bicycle network.

Of course, Hannover also has many places of interest in town (see "Around the City"). It is one of the greenest German cities, with the largest urban city forest in the country (the *Eilenriede*, with nearly twice the size of New York's Central Park), numerous parks, the unique baroque gardens in *Herrenhausen*, as well as rivers and lakes.

# How to register with the German authorities

After settling down in Hannover, your first stop as an **EU/EEA citizen** should be a *Bürgeramt*, a Citizens' Registration Office. You will have to register your permanent address in person **within two weeks** of your arrival. To do so, you can <u>make an appointment online</u>. On Thursdays, you can also visit without an appointment, but will have to wait. You will have to bring your ID and passport as well as a proof of residency by your landlord ("Wohnungsgeberbestätigung"). Please check the <u>city's service portal</u> for more information.

Under certain conditions, registration is now also possible online.

If you happen to move during your stay in Hannover, you will again have to register your new address in the *Bürgeramt* within two weeks.

Students coming from a **non-EU country** will also have to go to the *Bürgeramt* first, i.e. a Citizens' Registration Office (see above, please don't forget the proof of residency by your landlord/-lady).

After that, you have to go to the Welcome Service Department (Foreigners' Registration Office) of the State Capital of Hanover - *Ausländerbehörde (Ausländerstelle, Ausländeramt, Sachgebiet für Ausländeramt, angelegenheiten der Stadt Hannover*) to apply for a residence permit. The office can be found at *Am Schützenplatz 1* (the nearest subway station is "Waterloo"). As a general rule, you require a prior appointment for visiting the Students and Professionals team. You need to book this appointment with <a href="mailto:abh-fus@hannoverstadt.de">abh-fus@hannoverstadt.de</a>. The application form for the residence permit, as well as a checklist with the required documents can be found here.

To get the residence permit, non-EU students must usually present the following documents (no guarantee, please always check online):

- fully completed application form
- valid passport
- biometric photograph
- rental agreement
- proof of health insurance coverage
- certificate of enrolment
- proof of financing (available in the PhD office)
- copy of registration at Bürgeramt

# **Opening a Bank Account**

(We usually deal with this in the orientation weeks.)

A checking/current account *(Girokonto)* is very useful in Germany, because money transactions (e.g. for rents) are usually made through bank transfers or direct debits. With a German EC card you can also withdraw cash free of charge at many ATMs *(Geldautomat)* or at the checkout in some supermarkets.

Most importantly: You need a German bank account in order for MHH to transfer your scholarship or salary every month!

In general, students do not have to pay any (or very little) account management fees. To open an account, please take along your passport or national identity card, the letter of acceptance of the MHH or your enrolment certificate as well as your registration document, which you will obtain at the *Bürgeramt*. Please note that you may not overdraw your bank account except in cases specially allowed by the bank.

! Of course, you can also open a German bank account online (e.g. ING DiBa, N26); this may be a little less bureaucratic. !

# **Cost of Living**

A minimum of approximately  $800 - 1.000 \in$  per month is required to live on and come up for the following necessities (all costs are estimated):

- rent and energy costs: between 300 € and 600 €
- groceries: approx. 200-300 €; affordable lunch is available for approx. 2.40 € 4.30 € in the canteen of the MHH (Mensa), which is open on weekdays from 12 p.m. to 2 p.m.
- health insurance: (if not provided by the respective national insurance): approx. 80-100 € per month
- semester contribution (approx. 400 € for 6 months), payable at the beginning of each semester
- personal expenses for working materials, clothing, telephone, Internet, radio and TV licence fees, recreational activities, and the like: approx. 100-300 €

# Shopping

It is impossible to generalize about products found on Germany's sprawling retail landscape. Product prices and quality vary enormously and comparison is a wise idea. Department stores (*Kaufhäuser*) have just about every imaginable product in stock. In specialty shops, prices are usually higher but you get a better service.

There are several supermarkets: "Edeka", "Rewe" and "Marktkauf" are a little more expensive, but offer a wide variety of food. Every price-conscious shopper in Germany knows names like "Aldi", "Lidi", "Penny", "NP", etc.. They opt for a warehouse-like atmosphere and sell their products from the crates they were shipped in. In any event, a little comparison shopping goes a long way, wherever you decide to buy.

There are many local street/farmer markets in the different districts of Hannover. Please check <u>online</u> or ask your neighbors.

You can best buy cosmetics and some OTC medical products in drugstores like "dm", "Rossmann" or "Müller". Most drugs you can only purchase in pharmacies, called "Apotheke".

Nowadays, you can pay with debit card or payment app almost everywhere. However, some stores still refuse to take credit cards.

When buying expensive items, remember to keep your receipt, since the product guarantee is only valid if you can present your original proof of purchase.

#### **Opening Hours**

From Monday to Friday, most stores open between 6-10 a.m. and close between 6-10 p.m; large grocery stores tend to have the longest opening hours. On Saturdays, small shops close between 1-4 p.m., although in the city center most stay open until 6 or 8 p.m. **Shops are usually closed on Sundays and public holidays!** On the four Saturdays before Christmas, you can allow yourself a little more time, since some retail shops keep their doors open until 8 p.m.

The "LIDL" in the basement of Hannover main station is open daily from 6.00 a.m. to 10 p.m. (Sundays from 9 a.m.). Other shops in this train station are also open on Sundays.

#### **Discounts for students**

For students, there is usually some sort of discount everywhere. Museums and other cultural institutions such as theaters, opera houses, concert halls, and cinemas offer special student rates. At sport centers and swimming pools, students may also qualify for a discount. When in doubt, ask — it doesn't cost anything.

Travelling abroad is also somewhat cheaper for students. The <u>International Student Identity Card (ISIC)</u> is always helpful in this case. It costs around 18 euros for one year. Each ISIC is a virtual card that is stored in your account in the ISIC app as soon as you have registered. If you like, you can order an additional plastic card for an extra 5 euros. The ISIC allows discounts on flights, package tours, accommodation, car hire as well as in some restaurants and online shops.

If you are under 27, **travelling by train** is also cheaper. For example, there is the <u>super saver fare ticket for young people</u>. Young travelers can also purchase a <u>My BahnCard 25 or My BahnCard 50</u> to receive a 25% or 50% discount on long-distance travel fares. <u>Interrail</u> offers you a flat rate for travelling Europe by rail within a chosen period of time. You can obtain information on rates from rail travel counters or on the internet.

Anyone who likes travelling will also find a <u>German Youth Hostel Membership Card</u> helpful. The annual membership fee for Juniors (up to 26 years) is 7 euros. This membership card is your entry ticket to about 400 youth hostels in Germany, and to more than 4.000 youth hostels in over 80 countries worldwide.

#### **Main Attractions**

#### **New City Hall**

Viewed from the surrounding Maschpark, the beautiful <u>New City Hall</u> (Neues Rathaus) is one of Hannover's most popular photo spots. Inside you can find city models of Hannover at four different times that illustrate the city's development: in 1689, in 1939, after the destruction in 1945 and today.

A peculiarity of the city hall is the <u>curved dome lift</u>, which is not going vertical, but tilts 17 degrees! It takes you to a platform with a stunning view over Hannover. On a clear day, you can see as far as the *Deister* and even the *Harz* mountains.

#### Old City Hall and Market Church in the Old Town

The <u>Old City Hall</u> and the <u>Market Church</u> next door are considered the southernmost showpieces of North German brick Gothic architecture.

#### Lake Maschsee

<u>Lake Maschsee</u> is a big artificial lake and a popular recreational area in the very heart of Hannover. In addition to sailing, rowing, pedal boating and surfing, you can also swim at Maschsee lido. You can also take a ride with one of the <u>Maschsee boats</u> of the Üstra. The 6 km circular path around the lake is ideal for walking, jogging, inline skating or cycling. If you wish to take a break, there's a wide selection of beer gardens, cafés and restaurants to choose from along the shore.

#### **Royal Gardens of Herrenhausen**

The Royal Gardens of Herrenhausen are among the most important and best-preserved gardens in Europe. The <u>Great Garden</u> is a huge baroque park with beautiful fountains and sculptures. Many events also take place here such as garden illuminations, <u>international firework competitions</u>, or the popular cabaret festival "<u>Little Festival in the Big Garden</u>". The reconstructed <u>Herrenhausen Palace</u> was opened in 2013 and now houses a museum on the garden history and more.

To the north of the Great Garden lies the <u>Berggarten</u>, a botanical show garden with the largest orchid collection in Europe and a mausoleum for members of the Hanoverian royal family. The third part of the royal gardens is the <u>Georgengarten</u>, and English style garden with popular picnic areas.

# Gardens, Parks and Zoo

#### **City Park (Stadtpark)**

The <u>City Park</u> south of the Hannover Congress Centrum is one of the nicest parks in Hannover. In 1951, the first Federal Garden Show (BUGA) was held here. In this park, you can find various water plants in the water grounds and a rose garden with 120 different kinds of roses that bloom in June and July. You may also find rhododendrons in May and perennial herbs from August till September. A highlight in the city park is the Japanese tea garden, where sometimes tea-ceremonies take place.

#### **Eilenriede**

The <u>Eilenriede</u> is a huge urban forest with a rich animal and plant population, an extensive walking and cycling path system, as well as big meadows and pond-like water grounds. Here, you can also find an <u>exercise trail</u>, numerous playgrounds, a <u>forest station</u> with observation tower, and several forest restaurants.

# **Tiergarten**

The <u>Tiergarten</u> is a wildlife park with beautiful old trees and free living fallow deer. The *Tiergarten* is also home to wild boar and roe deer as well as to numerous bird species.

# **Transportation**

Hannover is an important transportation hub in Germany and Europe and well connected by plane, train, long-distance bus and car.

- Hannover Airport
- Deutsche Bahn / German Railways
- Long-distance buses to and from Hannover

The easiest way to get around the city is by tram, bus or bicycle.

The trams and buses in the city and the surrounding area are operated by the transport company "ÜSTRA". You can use them with the *Deutschland-Ticket* included in your semester ticket (see below).

Since Hannover has hardly any mountains, it is very easy to get around the city by bike. "*Fietsenbörsen I* Bicycle fairs" are held regularly on *Ernst-August-Platz* in front of the main train station, where used bicycles are sold at fair prices. The Hannover Lost and Found Office holds bicycle auctions at various locations in the city every few months. You can also find affordable used bicycles on the MHH bulletin board or on the classified's platform <a href="https://www.kleinanzeigen.de/">https://www.kleinanzeigen.de/</a>.

As MHH student, you can get free bicycle repairs at <u>Pro Beruf GmbH – Die Fahrradwerkstatt</u> (Bonifatiusploatz 1-2, 30161 Hannover). You only have to pay for spare parts.

Besides, various providers offer bike, cargo bike and e-scooter rental.

The car-sharing company "Stadtmobil" provides rentals of vehicles of all sizes as well as cargo bikes. Different rates are offered depending on frequency of use. As a Stadtmobil member, you can also use car sharing services in many other German cities.

In addition, there are ride-sharing services such as MOIA and Uber.



# **Deutschland-Ticket / Germany Ticket**

Your semester ticket includes a "**Deutschland-Ticket** / **Germany Ticket**". You can view the ticket by entering your date of birth and student ID number at the following link: <a href="https://abo.ride-ticketing.de/app/login?partnerId=c2d680f351acc80be32426e24fdff7df">https://abo.ride-ticketing.de/app/login?partnerId=c2d680f351acc80be32426e24fdff7df</a>. You can then access the ticket in your browser for verification, or you can download it to Google Wallet or Apple Wallet (other wallets are also possible).

With the Germany Ticket you can travel throughout Germany on all local public transport. It can be used on local trains such as RB, RE, S-Bahn trains and also buses, trams, subways, etc. The Deutschland-Ticket is NOT valid on trains operated by DB Fernverkehr AG or other long-distance providers such as FlixTrain (e.g. IC, EC, ICE). Furthermore, the Deutschland-Ticket is not valid on tourist or historical trains.
