Early priming and prevention

At the Center for Pediatrics and Adolescent Medicine at Hannover Medical School (MHH), three of ten positions for physicians in further training to become specialists in pediatrics and adolescent medicine will be filled in 2021 in a **Clinician Scientist Program** for pediatricians. The post holders will become members of the research college **TITUS** "**The First Thousand Days of Life**", which includes 18 months of research time in defined projects and working groups on the topic of "**Early priming and prevention**" in addition to clinical training. The research activity can be carried out in various working groups of the Children's Hospital and the **Institutes of Immunology, Experimental Hematology and Genetics** in close cooperation with the Children's Hospital. TITUS is largely funded by the **Else-Kröner-Fresenius Foundation** and supported by the MHH.

The call is addressed to physicians who are in further training to become a specialist in pediatrics and adolescent medicine or who are aiming for this and who have a high scientific interest as well as research experience. A completed doctorate is a prerequisite for application. Members of the Research College TITUS are offered excellent structured clinical and scientific training in an inspiring environment that prepares them very well for a university career as "Clinican Scientists". The job offer includes combined clinical and scientific training for an initial 3 years.
